

Dear beloved brothers and sisters,







Yayasan Dunia Viva Wanita (Viva Wanita) is a non-profit organization based in Batam, Riau Islands, Indonesia. Established in 2011 and registered under Indonesian National Law and the Ministry of Law and Human Rights. Viva Wanita is committed to empowering women and children, particularly those from migrant communities and vulnerable communities who are at risk or victim of human trafficking and violence. The organization pursues this mission through education, skills development, and community engagement programs.

YD VW HISTORY

Yayasan Dunia Viva Wanita (YD VW) was motivated by the late Ms Bridget Tan who concern and feels the injustice and abused of the right that often experienced by migrant workers returnees, she is also the founder of Humanitarian Organization of Migration Economic (HOME) in Singapore provides shelter and advocacy services for migrant workers especially for woman domestic workers, training services and legal assistance for male and female migrant workers in Singapore.

She is a pioneer and activist for migrant workers who have given the rest of her life to fight and campaigning for the right of migrant workers. With her retirement money she founded HOME in 2004 in Singapore and she founded Solidaritas Migran Scalabini Association in Batam Indonesia in 2007 and turn to foundation namely Yayasan Dunia Viva Wanita (YD VW) in 2011.

During Ms Bridget Tan running HOME Singapore, she received a lot of complaints from migrant workers who return to Indonesia via Batam, where actually their origin province is was not from Batam, usually the migrant workers returnees doesn't know about Batam and there is no one in Batam for them to get help when they get into trouble, and they are vulnerable to become victims of abused and human trafficking in Batam. Ms Bridget Tan sees the importance to make cross borders networking in transit area like Batam to bridging of migrant workers returning from Singapore and Malaysia. In 2007 Ms Bridget Tan decide to establish the Solidaritas Migran Scalabini Association in Batam Indonesia and the first services was a shelter for migrant workers returnees.

Our Late Founder Profile



29 September 1948 – 18 April 2022 was a Singaporean migrant-worker rights activist and the founder of the Humanitarian Organisation for Migration Economics (HOME). After retiring from her private sector career, she began for the Archdiocesan Commission for the Pastoral Care of Migrants and Itinerant People (ACMI), which she later chaired. In 2004, she founded HOME to provide support and advocacy for migrant workers. In 2011, she established Dunia Viva Wanita Foundation (YDVW) Indonesia, Her work earned recognition from Asia Society, the United States Department of State, and the governments of Thailand and the Philippines

Ms Bridget Tan was an activist for migran workers rights in Singapore

- 2004 – Bridget Tan founded the Humanitarian Organization for Migration Economics (HOME), dedicated to providing support and advocacy for migrant workers in Singapore.
- 2005 – Nominated for the Nobel Peace Prize by Peace Women Across the Globe.
- 2011 – Received an Award for Her Actions in Ending Modern Slavery from U.S. Secretary of State Hillary Clinton.
- 2011 – Expanded her mission by establishing a similar organization in Indonesia, the World Foundation for Women (Yayasan Dunia Viva Wanita).
- 2015 – Inducted into the Singapore Women’s Hall of Fame for her outstanding contributions to migrant workers in Singapore.
- 2022 – Bridget Tan passed away, but her spirit and legacy continue to live on with us.

Viva Wanita is committed to strengthening community capacity through education, skill development, livelihood initiatives, and public awareness programs that improve the quality of life for individuals and communities.

Pillar Engagement

In realizing Viva Wanita's vision and mission in education, skills development, and livelihood programs, including initiatives to raise public awareness on HIV and AIDS prevention, human trafficking, and violence against women and children, we collaborate with NGO partners, government agencies, and private organizations.

Program & Services

Education Program

Little Angel Kindergarten School & Reading House

Since 2011, Viva Wanita has been providing early childhood education programs for children in marginalized communities through Little Angel Kindergarten schools and Reading Houses in several migrant communities living in informal settlements and coastal areas in Batam, located in Kampung Air, Bukit Timur, Kampung Baru, Teluk Lengung, and Teluk Waheng.

The residents of these communities are mostly migrants from various provinces in Indonesia. We manage five Little Angel Kindergarten schools and Reading Houses, which each year serve around 200 kindergarten students and approximately 300 children and adolescents in the surrounding communities. The schools and Reading Houses are also used as spaces for children's and youth activities after school hours, such as playing, learning to read, learning English, group study, learn to sing and dance, and other activities.



March 10–14, a Social Visit and Community Service Learning Program by Singapore Republic Polytechnic was conducted at Little Angel Kindergarten, Kampung Air.



March 24-28 a Social Visit and Community Service Learning Program by Singapore Republic Polytechnic was conducted at Little Angel Kindergarten, Teluk Lengung.



On May 10-11, LSBC Singapore visited Little Angel Kindergarten in Kampung Air. On this occasion, LSBC also distributed basic food supplies to elderly residents from underprivileged families in Kampung Air.

Viva Bintang Bangsa Kindergarten School

Viva Bintang Bangsa (VBB) Kindergarten has been operating since 2021. It is a formal school that provides early childhood education for the general community. Its purpose is to ensure that VBB teachers have access to appropriate teaching and learning methods and curricula that meet the education standards set by the government and the Ministry of Education. The teachers of Viva Bintang Bangsa Kindergarten then share and facilitate the application of these learning methods and education standards with teachers from the five Little Angel Kindergartens. In 2025 we serve 33 students.

Scholarship Program

Since 2012, Viva Wanita has provided scholarship assistance for women and children from underprivileged communities at the elementary, junior high, and senior high school levels, with some continuing their studies at universities in Batam and outside Batam. Several Viva Wanita staff members and teachers have also had the opportunity to pursue higher education through this program.

Viva Wanita also provides scholarships for dropout-of-school children from low-income families to resume their education by offering financial support for formal schooling or equivalency education programs at the elementary, junior high, and senior high levels.



Total impact on this program this year from elementary school to university is 18 students.



Community Learning Activity Center

The Community Learning Activity Center (CLAC) is a non-formal education program that provides learning opportunities for the community. It implements Equality Education through Package A (Elementary), Package B (Secondary), and Package C (Senior High School), along with skills training programs. CLAC aims to support school dropouts in gaining knowledge and skills equivalent to formal education, enabling them to pursue higher education or employment.

The program began in September 2025 with 10 students and is currently held every Saturday using a meeting room. It is managed by a Viva Wanita scholarship recipient from Open University of Batam and her team, in collaboration with part-time teachers from elementary, secondary, and senior high schools.

Since July 2025, CLAC has also offered basic literacy and numeracy classes for children preparing for elementary school or those who cannot yet read or write, with 10 students currently enrolled. Future plans include baking classes for members of the Viva Women Community and the wider community.

Empowerment Program

English Learning Program

English proficiency is often a requirement for many job opportunities as Batam flourished into a major hub for international trade, manufacturing, technological, tourism and hospitality. Learning English can improve employability and potentially lead to higher-paying jobs, helping to alleviate poverty and improve living standards of the marginalized individuals and communities.

We started English Learning Program since November 2023. With this program about 30 of staff and teachers of Viva Wanita, more than 200 student of Viva Bintang Bangsa and Little Angel Kindergarten School, and more than 100 children and youth around the Little Angel Kindergarten School have significantly benefited by this program in every year.



Skills Training Program Assistance

Since 2012 Viva Wanita have been providing financial assistance for taking skill courses in several vocational education institution in Batam, such as sewing, computer and beauty salon courses, especially for women and children who are victims of human trafficking, exploitation, single mother, victim of domestic violence and women from underprivileged families.

Youth Community Viva Angels

Viva Angels is a youth community founded in 2021 in Kampung Air that supports young people in developing talents and interests in arts, sports, and skills such as futsal, dancing, singing, and English learning. The community also promotes youth participation in sports competitions, art performances, seminars, and campaigns on anti-human trafficking, HIV & AIDS prevention, anti-violence against women and children, and anti-bullying.

By 2024, youth from Bukit Timur, Kampung Baru, Teluk Ljung, and several senior high schools in Batam had joined and actively participated in Viva Angels programs. The community also formed Youth Care for HIV & AIDS, Human Trafficking, and Violence Against Women & Children in Batam.



In 2025, Viva Angels organized a futsal tournament for senior high school students on 20 July and celebrated National Children's Day on 27 July in Bukit Timur, attended by over 200 children and youth. Activities included seminars, quizzes, singing and coloring competitions



On 11 October, Viva Angels performed at the National Children's Day celebration organized by the Batam City Government, which awarded a certificate of appreciation to Viva Wanita.

Viva Women Community

Women empowerment aims to improve the role, quality of life, and status of women in society. Viva Women Community supports women by building skills, self-confidence, and active participation through sports, arts, skills training, and livelihood development. These activities help women become economically, socially, and personally independent while contributing to their communities.

Viva Women Community also organizes discussions, seminars, and training on issues such as human trafficking, violence against women and children, bullying, HIV/AIDS prevention, health, parenting, and environmental awareness. Through the Community Learning Activity Center (CLAC), baking classes are offered to members interested in learning to make cakes, bread, and cookies.

Together, Viva Women Community and Viva Angel Youth Community empower members to become positive agents of change for individuals, communities, and society.

Assistance Program

Since 2021, Viva Wanita has distributed basic food packages annually to underprivileged families, especially during the pandemic, disasters, and major holidays. In March 2025, 300 food packages were distributed before Hari Raya.

In May 2025, Viva Wanita donated 150 school bags, books, and supplies to Little Angel Kindergarten graduates, along with shoes for top students, supported by a Singaporean donor.

Through collaborations with NGOs, community groups, government institutions, and individual donors, Viva Wanita distributes over 1000 aid packages annually, including food, school supplies, shoes, and bags.

Viva Collection

Indonesia's rich cultural diversity creates frequent demand for traditional costumes, especially for events like performances, carnivals, and historical commemorations. Students from various schools including Little Angel and Viva Bintang Bangsa Kindergarten Schools, often needs traditional costumes for various events and performances, leading to frequent rentals. In response to the demand, Viva Wanita launched "Viva Collection" in June 2024 as part of the social enterprise program to rent out traditional costumes. This initiative serves both internal school needs and the wider Batam community, generating extra income for Viva Wanita. Both projects currently operate from a space at Viva Wanita House, serving as a showroom, packing area, and marketing office.



Viva Craft

Achieving some financial independence for the long-term sustainability of Viva Wanita is one of our key goals. To support this, Viva Crafts was launched as an initiative to generate additional income for the organization while educating women about small businesses and creating income for their families. Through this program, community members with crafting skills are invited to teach others women at their community who are interest to learn about crafting skills. In this program, Viva Wanita providing initial capital, overseeing product selection, packaging, branding, and developing marketing strategies to sell the products under the "Viva Crafts".

Livelihood Program

This program supports women aged 40 and above and single mothers who face limited job opportunities and lack access to business capital. It provides revolving business capital, training, promotion, and mentoring to help women start or strengthen small home-based businesses.

Support includes staged capital, basic business training, digital marketing guidance, and 12 months of monitoring. Once beneficiaries become independent, they return part of the capital to support new participants. Viva Wanita also assists underprivileged women by funding sewing machines, food processing tools, handicrafts, homemade food businesses, and other small enterprises.

Engagement

Guided by the principle of “Building Community, With Community, From Community, For the Community,” we believe community empowerment succeeds through active community participation. Involvement in implementation and evaluation fosters responsibility and supports socio-economic development, including awareness of rights, social justice, education, health, and public policy. Since 2011, Viva Wanita has collaborated with NGOs, government, and private institutions on education, skills, livelihoods, and public awareness initiatives, including HIV/AIDS prevention, human trafficking, and violence against women and children. On 1 December 2025, Viva Wanita and Safe Migrant Batam marked World AIDS Day with social media campaigns and seminars on HIV and AIDS.

Assistance Services for Migrant Workers

Helpline & Helpdesk

Viva Wanita provides a helpline (+62778-325596 or +62 813-7447-5745) and help desk services at Tiban Point, Block B1 No 1-2 #2, for women migrant workers facing issues. Clients seek assistance and advice on workplace problems in Batam, Singapore, and Malaysia, as well as information on HIV/AIDS, human trafficking, and violence against women and children. Viva Wanita offers support through counseling, shelter, reporting offenses to authorities, referrals to relevant services, medical treatment, rehabilitation, and reintegration.



Viva Wanita House

Since 2011, Viva Wanita has been operating a safe house (Viva Wanita House) for women migrant workers returning from Malaysia and Singapore, as well as for children who are victims of human trafficking and violence. Viva Wanita House serves as a temporary place to stay for those in critical situations, in Batam before they return to their home of origin. In each year, we provide housing about 10 to 20 women and children victim of human trafficking, exploitation and violence or other cases. On 2025, we served for 17 women. For victims who required legal assistance and stricter protection, for the safety of the victim, Viva Wanita will refer to government or safe Migrant shelter, which has more adequate facilities and security.

Collaboration Programs on Public Awareness for HIV & AIDS

HIV is not only a medical issue but also a social and human rights concern. Despite ongoing efforts, HIV and AIDS cases in Indonesia remain high, highlighting the need for accessible health services, stigma reduction, rights protection for people living with HIV, and effective prevention through education and public awareness. Since 2012, Viva Wanita has implemented HIV and AIDS prevention programs in Batam targeting youth, high school students, migrant and factory workers. In collaboration with the Batam HIV and AIDS Commission Secretariat, the program focuses on reproductive health education to reduce vulnerability to HIV, unplanned pregnancy, early marriage, and drug use. In 2025, around 5,000 people received HIV and AIDS prevention education, and on 1 December 2025 Viva Wanita and Safe Migrant Batam marked World AIDS Day with social media campaigns and seminars.

Collaboration Programs on Public Awareness for Human Trafficking & Violence Against Women & Children

Human trafficking remains a global threat driven by organized crime, exploiting migration flows, supply chains, legal gaps, and digital platforms for forced labor, sexual exploitation, and criminal activities. Migrant workers especially women and children are highly vulnerable. Violence against women and children also persists as a widespread human rights violation, often occurring in spaces meant to be safe and sometimes perpetrated by those closest to the victims.

Since 2011, Viva Wanita has raised awareness on these issues through collaboration with government bodies, NGOs, and international partners. Viva Wanita has become a member of Safe Migrant Batam since 2017, which provides legal assistance and advocacy, supporting over 200 women and child victims annually. Viva Wanita works with local authorities and partners such as Justice Without Borders, Indonesian Migrant Workers Protection Board, HOME Singapore, Tenaganita Malaysia, and IOM to provide legal aid, referrals, and reintegration support for trafficking and violence survivors.

Community Information Corner on Public Awareness for Anti Human Trafficking, Anti Violence Against Women & Children And HIV& AIDS Prevention Program



This initiative aims to reduce community vulnerability to these issues through easily accessible information.
